CHAPTER 10

LAW. ORDER AND JUSTICE

In the early times, one of the essential duties of the king concerned was maintenance of law and order. King appointed officers for maintaining public order and peace. Under different administrations, such officers were variously styled as Dharmapalaka, Kotwal, Police Patel, Gauda, and so on. By whatever designation they were addressed, their duty was to maintain law and order. The Adilshahis of Bijapur too had established a well-organised police force. Principalities like Jamkhandi, Mudhol, etc., also maintained their own police establishments.

The Police administration of the district of Bijapur may be studied first from the system prevalent since 1827. A well-organised police force was established under Regulation XII of 1827 and placed under the administrative control of the District Magistrate. At the village level the Police Patel was charged with the responsibility of maintaining peace and tranquillity. In the year 1862, the above-mentioned Regulation was amended by the Bombay District Police Act (1862). That was based on the provisions of the Indian Police Act, 1861, which defined the duties and powers of the Police officers. This Act was replaced by the Bombay Presidency Police Act, 1890, which meticulously described the jurisdiction and responsibilities of the police. This Act was in force until 1951, when the Bombay Police Act was introduced. Some years after the merger of Bijapur with the new Mysore State (Karnataka) in 1956, a comprehensive Police Act applicable to the entire state including the Bijapur district (1965) was introduced.

In the year 1965 the district police administration was under the control of the Deputy Inspector-General and the Superintendent of Police. The latter officer's control extended over the district's police force, armed police, drill, prevention and detection of crime and discipline. The district had been divided into three sub-divisions for administrative convenience, namely, Bijapur,

Indi and Bagalkot. They comprised with 32 police stations and 19 police out-posts.

In 1965 the district had a separate corps of detectives who were investigated crimes and examined reports about the criminal activities. For these purposes the services of an Inspector and unarmed Head Constables have been provided. A Special Branch was also employed in the district to collect information and to watch the activities of politicians, communal organisations, and trade unions, etc. This branch utilized the services of a sub-Inspector and Head Constables. There was also a separate police branch to investigate crimes pertaining to prohibition.

The District Superintendent of Police was the executive head of police force. He was functioning under the direction of the Deputy Inspector-General, North Division, Belgaum and the Inspector-General of Police, Mysore State, Bangalore.

Earlier, when district was part of the Bombay Province, the Inspector-General of Police there looked after the appointments to the police force, equipment, education and housing. Some changes occurred subsequently, and by 1982 Vijapur came to possess four sub-divisions, eight police circles, thirty-three police stations and nineteen police out-posts (total 64); and, in 1983 Total police personnel of the district is numbered 1,468. The following table gives details of the District Police Establishment between the years 1893 and 1996:

By and large law and order were well-maintained in the Bijapur district. Even under the Adilshahi rule excepting political disturbances public peace and tranquillity prevailed. During the years 1947-48 the Razakars are known to have caused some disturbances here and there. The considerable number of Hindus and Muslims in the district are a source of frequent misapprehension to public authorities during festive occasions; but they rarely, if ever, have ended in violence. A remarkable characteristic of this district is that the followers of different religions join together while celebrating religious festivals. The following is a brief statement concerning communal disturbances in the district during the decade 1986-1996.

- 1986 Peace and tranquillity was maintained throughout the district barring certain agitations by the students (9), labourers (1), others (16); and communal disturbances (8) necessitating the imposing of section 144 or section 35 of the Police Act occurred on 5 occasions. There were no agitation connected with border dispute.
- 1987 The year witnessed 7 agitations by students, 11 strikes and bundhs by others, and 2 public riots.
- 1988 There were 9 agitations by students, 12 strikes and bundhs by others, and 1 case of mob rioting.
- 1989 There were 4 student agitations; other agitations numbered 15 leading to violence on 10 occasions and imposition of section 144 and section 35 of the Police Act five times.
- 1990 Agitation by students 6, and blockage of road or rasta-roko 20; violence occurred at Benakatte, Neeruru, Nalasawada, and Golasangi villages leading to imposition of section 144 on five occasions.
- 1991 The year saw 10 agitations by students, and blockade of roads twice; rioting occurred at place like Guledagudda, Talikot, Bagalkot, and Balaganur culminating in police firing at Talikot. Section 144 Cr.P.C. was imposed on six occasions.

- 1992 There were 6 agitations by students, 11 road blockades, and one case of rioting by mob at a place called Bilgi.
- 1993 Student agitations 6, road-blockades 7; and, rioting by mob at places like Talikot and Bagalkot culminated in police firing in the latter.
- 1994 The year witnessed 12 agitations by students, and 32 road-blockades; in the agitation against the Karnataka Electricity Board office at Lokapura stone-throwing and disorder by mobs was reported on 10 occasions.
- 1995 The year witnessed 10 agitation by students, and 31 road-blockades; mob violence occurred at places like Basavana-Bagevadi, Kaladgi, Bagalkot, and Harishikari (Bijapur).
 - 1996 There were 14 agitation by students and road-blockades 32 times.

Village Defence Party

The Village Defence Parties have been active in 589 villages out of a total of 615. During 1998-99, a total of 12,871 persons had enrolled as members and 589 persons as dalapatis of the Village Defence Party. The force renders assistance to the police in investigation and prevention of crimes within the district. The local people are also trained by the Village Defence Parties.

Home Guards

The Home Guards are functioning in the district since 1947. In December 1998, there were 29 sub-branches of the force in the district. Generally, the services of the home guards are utilised on occasions like *Holi*, *Ganesha*, *Dasara*, *Moharrum*, *Bakrid*, and *Ramzan* festivals; Siddheswara fair (jatra); and, for *naka-bandi* duties.

Crime Investigation Branch

There were 18 habitual offenders under the jurisdiction of this branch (21 in 1997 and 44 in 1998). During 1996-97, there were no foreign criminals. The district had 39 habitual offenders as on 31-12-1997 at the end of the years 1996 and 1998 there were 21 and 44 such offenders respectively.

Dog Squad

The district maintains a Dog Squad since May 1993. Its services have been availed so far at 13 places in as many as 78 cases.

Police Band

The Police Band consists of 8 Head Constables and 6 Constables. Their services have been availed on several occasions; and, in 1998 a sum of Rs. 93,400 was collected by lending their services to private functions.

In 1998 Law and order was well maintained in the district. As a precautionary measure, all subordinate police staff had instructions to take into preventive custody local as well as outside elements with criminal background.

The Criminal Investigation Branch of the district, formed under the leadership of Additional Superintendent of Police, and detected several property-related crimes. All officers had instructions to visit the quarters inhabited by Harijans often and to hear the Grievances of the scheduled castes and the scheduled tribes people. The traffic police had instructions to apprehend over speeding and negligent drivers of motor vehicles.

Rural Police

The Rural Police officers are also functioning in the Bijapur district and they co-operate with the local police officers in the investigation and prevention of crimes.

Welfare of Police Personnel

The practice of providing separate housing to the families of police personnel with basic amenities has continued from early days. In the year 1960 about 670 police personnel had alloted Government Quarters besides 250 armed police personnel. On special occasions children of police personnel were granted scholarships and financial assistance during sickness. The Police Welfare Association and the Co-operative Society are also functioning in the district. In addition, amenities like separate Children's Park, Radio, Students' Club, Vegetable Garden, etc., have been created.

Since 1987 police personnel and their family members have obtained medical, educational and Family Benefit Fund facilities from the Police Welfare Fund. The number of beneficiaries under this programme was as below:

Police Stations in Bijapur District

There are 21 police stations in all in Bijapur district located at the following places: Gandhi Chowk, Golgumbaz, A.P.M.C. Rural, Babaleswara, Tikota, Bagewadi, Kolhara, Managoli, Muddebihal, Talikot, Indi, Horti, Sindgi, Alamela, Devara Hipparagi, Chadachana, Jhalaki, Shahara (wireless) and district (wireless).

Directorate of Prosecutions and Government Litigation

For the purpose of effective conduct of prosecution of criminal cases in the courts and to carefully scrutinise the materials collected by the police during the course of investigation with a view to determine whether they are sufficient to make the accused stand trial, a separate and independent Directorate of Prosecutions and Government Litigation was set up. Besides, the Directorate also supervises the conduct of Government Litigation in civil matters in the Munsiff and Munsiff Magistrate's Courts. In Bijapur district Public Prosecutor, Additional Public Prosecutor I, Public Prosecutor II (Special Court) and Public Prosecutor III have been working.

Judicial Administration (Pre-Independence Period)

The district of Vijapur was first constituted in the year 1864 by the merger of the following areas: Badami, Bagalokot and Hungund separated from Belgaum district; Bijapur from Satara district; and, Hippargi (Sindgi of the present), Indi, Muddebihal and Managooli (Bagevadi of the present) from Sholapura district. A separate court was established at Kaladagi. When in the year 1869 a Judicial Magistrate's Court was set up at Belgaum, Vijapur was also included under its jurisdiction; and, the separate court at Kaladagi was abolished. However, at Kaladagi an Assistant Judge was appointed who was vested with the powers of Joint Judge in regard to Criminal offences and general powers in regard to civil cases.

Civil Courts

Inclusive of the Senior Assistant Judge's Court, the district had four courts between the years 1870 and 1875. The average time taken to decide a case in those days was 43 days. Some time later the average time taken to decide a case increased to 116 days. In the year 1880 too the number of courts had remained the same but the average time taken to decide a case increased to 116 days. In the year 1880 too the number of courts had remained the same but the average time taken to decide a case had dropped to 97 days. By the year 1883, there were three subordinate judges besides a Senior Assistant Judge.

The jurisdiction of the Second Class Sub-Judge's (Subordinate Judge) Court at Bijapur extended over an area of comprising 2,495 square miles which included the taluks of Bijapur, Indi and Sindgi. The jurisdiction of the Second Class Subordinate Judge's Court at Bagalokot extended over an area comprising 1,892 square miles, which included the taluks of Badami, Bagalkot and Hunagund. Similarly, the Assistant Judge's Court at Muddebihal extended over an area comprising 1,309 square miles, which included the taluks of Muddebihal and Bagewadi. In relation to the different courts located at Kaladagi, Bijapur, Bagalkot and Muddebihal the farthest villages were at the distance of 116, 79, 59 and 40 miles respectively.

After the unification of Karnataka in 1956, the District Court remained the highest among the Courts in the Bijapur district. The District Judge could be appointed by the Governor in consultation with the High Court of Mysore as provided under Article 223 of the Constitution of India. The appointment of the Assistant Judge was also made by the Governor based on the recommendation of the High Court. The Bijapur District Court and its subordinate Courts were under the control of the High Court of Mysore. The Principal Court of appeal in respect of the cases decided by Civil Courts (10,000 to 20,000 rupees in value). The District Judge exercised powers of general control over all the Civil Courts and their staff; they also enjoyed powers of inspection of those courts. In addition to the District Judge, there were the I Additional District Judge and II Additional District Judge in the Bijapur district.

Civil Suits

There was a Civil Court presided over by a Civil Judge in the Bijapur district. Its jurisdiction extended over all original suits depending on valuation. It also received for enquiry appeals concerning to the judgment or decrees passed by the Munsiff Courts in the district.

There were two Munsiff Civil Courts in the district with jurisdiction extending over the taluks of Bijapur, Indi and Sindgi. They could admit and dispose of suits not exceeding Rs. 1000 in value. There were also eight Munsiff Courts in the district at Badami, Bagevadi, Hundgund, Jamkhandi, Muddebihal and Bagalkot (2) presided over by ex-officio I Class Magistrates.

In 1964-95, a total of 3,558 original civil suits were pending of which 176 were decided. Besides, 188 regular civil appeals and 52 other civil appeals were also decided in the same year.

Criminal Suits

The criminal suits transferred from the Judicial Magistrate were decided by the District Judge of Bijapur (who also acted as Sessions Judge). The I Additional Sessions Judge decided cases filed under the anti-corruption act of 1947. There were two sessions judges in the district and any death sentence passed by them had to be confirmed by the High Court. All the judicial magistrates were placed under the control of the Sessions Judge who exercised the powers of inspecting the courts of magistrates and other subordinate courts.

There are two criminal courts in the Bijapur district each presided over by a I Class Judicial Magistrate. One of these was concerned with the cases falling under Bijapur town limits and railway cases, while the other was concerned with the remaining cases from the Bijapur taluk. The jurisdiction of the I class Judicial Magistrate at Indi extended to Sindgi taluk also. There are two munsiff courts at Bagalkot of which one decides criminal cases of the Bagalkot and the Bilgi taluks. The munsiffs at Badami, Bagewadi, Hungund, Jamkhandi, Mudebihal and Mudhol will perform duties of magistrates.

In 1964-65, 12,940 criminal cases were registered and the number of pending cases was 14,145. Out of these 13,307 cases were decided; and, out of 178 pending criminal cases 130 were decided.

District Legal Aid Committee, Bijapur

The District Legal Aid Committee provides legal assistance to the economically backward persons. Among its substantive functions must be mentioned: (1) providing free legal aid to the scheduled caste and scheduled tribe persons, and to women and economically backward persons; (2) to organise Lok Adalats; and, to organise camps in rural areas under the Vidyaprasara Programme.

This committee consists of Chairman/Secretary assisted by an officer and a dalayat. This committee started functioning from 25 January 1984. It was redesignated as District Legal Authority from 19 April, 1987.

During January 1998 a Janata Court was organised at Bijapur where 201 Criminal cases, 19 other cases, and 247 Motor Vehicle cases were decided. During the months of July-August, 1998 4 Civil suits, 27 Criminal suits were disposed of in the and 9 civil suits, 3 Criminal cases, and 4 other cases were disposed of in the Court at Bagalkot.

Family Court, Bijapur

The Family Court at Bijapur was established in 1993. It adjudicates marital disputes in particular. Details of cases disposed of in this court are furnished below:
