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NOTES FOR THE REVISION OF VOLUME XXII.

Area.—In 1885 an area of 68 square miles was transferred from the Bādāmi tāluka of the Bijāpur district to the Ron tāluka of this district. This change and the measurement of the survey carried out in 1874—1902 has increased the area of the district from 4,534 to 4,602 square miles. The tāluka variations are :—

Recent Surveys.—The Revision Survey of which the rates were introduced between 1874—1901, showed an increase in the total culturable area of 22,864 acres. By the revised settlement the total assessment on the Government occupied land was raised by Rs. 6,17,324 from Rs. 12,77,626 to Rs. 18,94,950 equal to an increase of 48 per cent. Tāluka variations are not available.

The rates now in force and other details of assessments, dates, &c., are given in Table XV.

Additional means of communication.—The Southern Marāthā Railway, which runs through the district dividing into two branches at Hubli, was opened between 1884—86. One branch connects Poona and Bangalore, from which a second runs north from Hubli to Hotgi through Gadag and Bijāpur. In 1902-03 there were 373 miles of metalled road and 895 miles of road suitable for fair weather traffic in the district. The three cotton mills have 44,408 spindles, and a paid up capital of Rs. 18,00,000.

Famine.—In 1891-92 there was slight scarcity in the district, which was tided over without recourse to elaborate measures of relief. Partial famine occurred in 1896-97, mainly due to failure of crops in the affected tracts, from the want of seasonable rain. The area affected was 857 square miles. Relief works were opened and continued for 14 months. The maximum daily average number relieved was 4,444 in September. Slight scarcity in 1899-1900 led to the opening of relief works, but they were practically unattended, only 256 persons being employed at the worst season. In 1900-1901, 357 square miles were slightly affected. Relief works were opened in February with a daily average of 360 workers, which rose to 1,892 in May. The number gratuitously relieved was 171 in April 1901. (For further details, see Table XIII.)

Plague.—The first outbreak of plague occurred in the city of Hubli in November 1897, and the infection spread with rapidity. Throughout September, October, November and December 1898, the Dhārwar district suffered from the severest epidemic recorded since the beginning of plague in September 1896. The infection was carried to Gadag in November 1898, over 320 places being affected by the epidemic. The district has suffered very severely since 1901, over 50,000 cases having occurred during the last three years. The total mortality from the plague up to the end of 1903-04 amounted 149,851 or 13 per cent. of the total population.
